On 5/20/69, FOIA(b) (7) - (D) made available a list of names to whom invitations were mailed to participate in captioned vigil, to be held at the Federal Bldg., 1520 Market St., St. Louis, 5/22/69. Vigil is sponsored by the Women's International League for Peace and Freedom (WILPF), and is to last 17 hours while participants read the list of the Vietnam War dead from the Congressional Record (35,000 names). The persons mentioned in this list are not those actually participating in captioned matter, but only a mailing list sent out from the Peace Information Center (PIC), SLMO. Original list maintained informant's 1-A file.

A memorial is to be held in the lobby of
 the Federal Bldg. 1520 Market - Thurs May 22 - 1 P.M.
 It will consist of the reading of attached copy
 and continue with the reading of just the
 names dead in Vietnam & then all the
 dead listed in the Congressional Record. This
 should take 17 hours. Since a similar
 service was held in Philadelphia and they
 were permitted to stay the night inside the
 Federal Bldg the hope is that it will be
 permitted here in St. Louis. ~~In Philadelphia~~
 there were 3 rules - 1 - Those locked in at 5 P.M.
 were not permitted to leave - 2 - Use of restrooms -
 3 - The promise that no property would be
 destroyed. Frank Buppert gave the ~~strong~~
 legal side of it by saying if we are asked
 to leave & refuse it would mean automatic
 arrest. and that any charge could be used
 from peace disturbance, interfering with tin
 markers, to not having a state tax seal on
 a pack of cigarettes.

The group plans to form a circle in
 the center of the lobby and if asked to leave

will go outside on the mall. If asked to leave the mall then its anybody's guess what will happen. Frank Ruppert stated that he would be in court all that day and not available in case of arrest. Jan Egnor & Barbara Brassman & Ann Sumner want to go to the Draft Board and read the statement, with a few others, possibly Danie Daley, Nancy Cole & Judy Bon. And invite the workers to join the vigil. Getting past "Watchdog" Mrs Ward caused some second thoughts. B. Brassman stated that even going towards the elevator could cause arrest & the idea did not displease her.

The idea of applying for a permit & taking a legal; "we have no ulterior motives in mind" was suggested by Nancy Cole & vetoed, ~~as~~ because we couldn't get past the front door.

The press will be informed, the group is counting on the press to give coverage such that the Feds will look like idiots trying to stop a mourning service of both Vietnamese & U.S. dead.

Access will be all in black, white arm bands, veil have sign of mourning. Marshalls will be appointed to be refused to by press, & hecklers or the curious. The under current was one of "watch it! Anything may happen"

Butch Henry explained what they were trying to do at Ft. L. Wood. (Refer to Eden Jennings Report) He also stated that saw a physical description inquired by the visitor + by prisoners, of each other. Some prisoners are furnishing some redemptans for outsiders. James Phell stated that he will tell anything he knows that will help get visitors in the stocks but that he cannot do anything because he would end up in the stocks.

Miss Helen D. Cummins stated Menner was getting married this summer, she is not quite sure how she likes the idea of his marrying Jane Bunden? Menner, Sister John Malone & Jane were on their way back from Milwaukee, attending the trial of Milwaukee. She stated the Catoonsville 9 were subpoenaed for the defenses, allowed by the judge, so they could get the issue of the war into the trial. The trial is going better than expected she said.

May 22, 1969. A Memorial Service was held in the lobby of the Federal Bldg 1520 Market. This was the Viet Nam Memorial honoring Vietnamese & American dead & protesting the draft & the war. The organizers of the service Janit Egner, Barbara Bressman, Yvonne Logan. Among those attending were Yvonne Logan, Leonard Tinker, Eldora Spiegelberg, Rev. Billy Epps, F. Bill O'Fallon, Rev. Don Register, Lois ~~Back~~ Back, Bill Barnes, Nancy Cole, Barbara Bressman, Jan Egner, Audrey Asanson, Butch Druisy, Rev. Mathis, Judi Roman, Vivian Schatz, Jan Yimm, Ann Sumners, Carol Gasey, Sister Anna Barbara (Webster College), Annette Westman, Sister Maria (Webster).

Short Talks or Prayers were given by Leonard Tinker, F. O. Fallon, Yvonne Logan, Rev. B. Epps, Rev. Don Register (Rev. Mathis). Then the Reading of the Missouri Dead was done by Audrey Asanson, Bill Barnes, Sister Anna Barbara. Then the reading from the Congressional Record of the US dead was passed from person to person. The vigil was to continue through the night.

Jan. Egner & Nancy Cole went to the Selective Service Board to deliver a letter of invitation to the workers to join them. Vivian Schatz & Nancy Cole passed out letters of explanation on the service to people on the 2nd floor.

Jan Egner stated by phone if asked to leave the Fed. Bldg at 1 PM 12-15 Hard Core would refuse to leave & be arrested.
